If you be resident wey dey eligible, you go need permit before you fit do Hajj. You fit get am through the Nusuk app after you don buy the right package

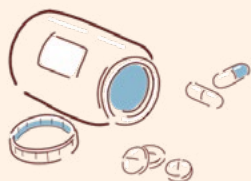


Wetin You Need Know About Valuables

You get expensive items? Abeg no carry am unless say e really important.

Remember:

If wetin you carry pass 60,000 Saudi Riyals (about 16,000 USD), you must declare am for customs.



Medicine & Banned Things

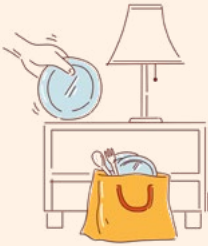
Carry only your correct medicine with doctor paper (prescription) wey explain your condition.

No try bring illegal drugs o!

Saudi no dey play – if dem catch you with banned medicine or drugs, na serious gbege be that. You fit enter big wahala.

To sabi more: Check the official list of things wey dem no dey allow inside Saudi.

Things Wey Fit Bring Wahala (Wey You Go Pay Fine For):



Destroy public or private things



Smoking for places wey people dey (especially closed areas or central areas like Markaziyah)

Break any Hajj law or instruction

Work Matter During Hajj

Your Hajj visa no be work visa. You no fit work or sell anything – even small market for roadside or inside mosque courtyard na illegal. No try am.

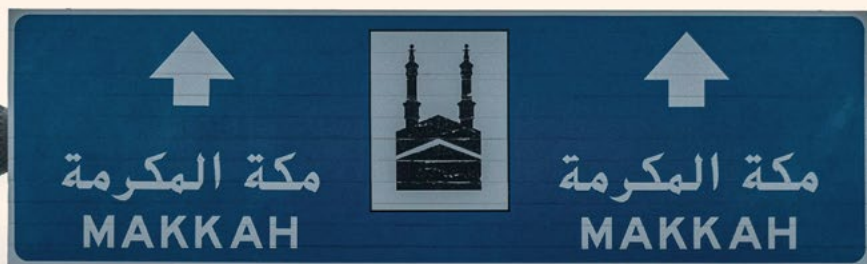

Once you enter Saudi, na so you don near the Holy House of Allah and the Prophet's Mosque (SAW). We welcome you with plenty love and ready help – all the process na to make sure you and other Guests of Al-Rahman get smooth entry.

Remember wetin Prophet Muhammad (SAW) talk:

«Whoever do Hajj wey no misbehave or sin, go come back like new born – no sin at all.»





At the Border – Entry Process



Keep your passport for hand or pocket way easy to reach –
go fasten the checking process.



No go enter crowd, wait small-small.

E go help you avoid stress or confusion.



If you need help, ask.

We get people for border way dey help pilgrims for free.



If your passport lost, no panic.

Tell your group leader or immigration officer (Jawazat) sharp-sharp.



Small Tip:

Snap your passport and keep am for your phone. E fit help if the original miss.

When You Wan Collect Your Bag



Keep your ticket info and bag claim receipt well.



If your bag lost, go the luggage office direct.
Dem go support you well.



Ask where dem dey bring your bag based on your flight number – no dey waka up and down.



Before you land, make sure you don get your company rep contact and their office address.



No Bag Wahala Initiative

If you dey part of the «Pilgrim Without a Bag» program, your bag go meet you for your lodge – no need to carry from airport.



Nusuk

Your First Padi for Saudi

From airport to border, Nusuk system dey guide pilgrims 24/7.

After your passport check, look out for Nusuk officials and follow their direction. Dem go help you reach your place safe.



Before You Leave Airport

Confirm transport plan with your group leader (Murshid Al-Hamla).

Stick with your group – no go waka alone.



If you miss your group, find Nusuk people – dem go help you.

“See now, na those “small-small bags” wey you pack earlier dey save you plenty stress.
Still dey your country? Go check that your packing again!”

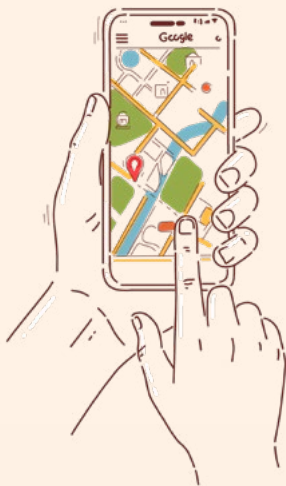

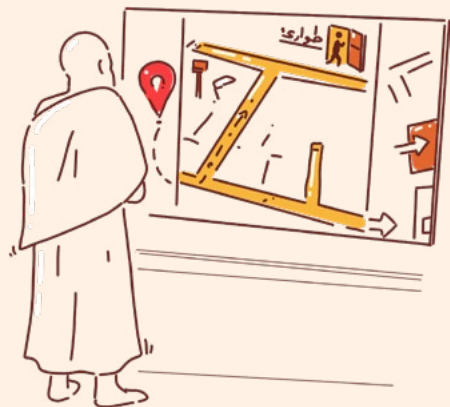

Performing the Rituals (Nusuk)

This chapter includes a brief explanation of the Hajj actions.

We remind you of the necessity to consult the campaign's Mufti to observe the rulings of your Fiqh school (Madhhab).

Ihram

Pilgrims enter Ihram on their way to Makkah Al-Mukarramah and before entering it. The Miqat for people [from Egypt] is Al-Juhfah, near the province of Rabigh.



How?

Performing Ghusl (ritual bath) and wearing Ihram clothes (Izar and Rida' - white cloths for men; modest clothing for women without covering the face and hands).

Intention (Niyyah) to enter the state of Nusuk according to the type of Hajj:

Ifrad: Intention for Hajj only.

Tamattu': Intention for Umrah first, then exiting Ihram, then performing Hajj.

Qiran: Intention to combine Hajj and Umrah without exiting Ihram.

Talbiyah: "Labbayka Allahumma Labbayk, Labbayka la sharika Laka Labbayk, Inna-l-hamda wa-n-ni'mata Laka wal-mulk, La sharika Lak." (Here I am, O Allah, here I am. Here I am, You have no partner, here I am. Verily all praise and blessings are Yours, and all sovereignty, You have no partner.)

Abstaining from the prohibitions of Ihram

(cutting hair, trimming nails, applying perfume, wearing stitched clothing [for men], sexual relations...).

Remember the following:

It is recommended (Mustahabb) to utter the intention formula, such as “Labbayka Hajjan” (Here I am for Hajj).

Do not use perfume after entering Ihram; perfume is prohibited after the intention of Ihram, so it is recommended to apply it only before entering Ihram.

Wear appropriate Ihram clothing: men must wear an unstitched Izar and Rida', and women wear their regular modest clothes without covering the face and hands.

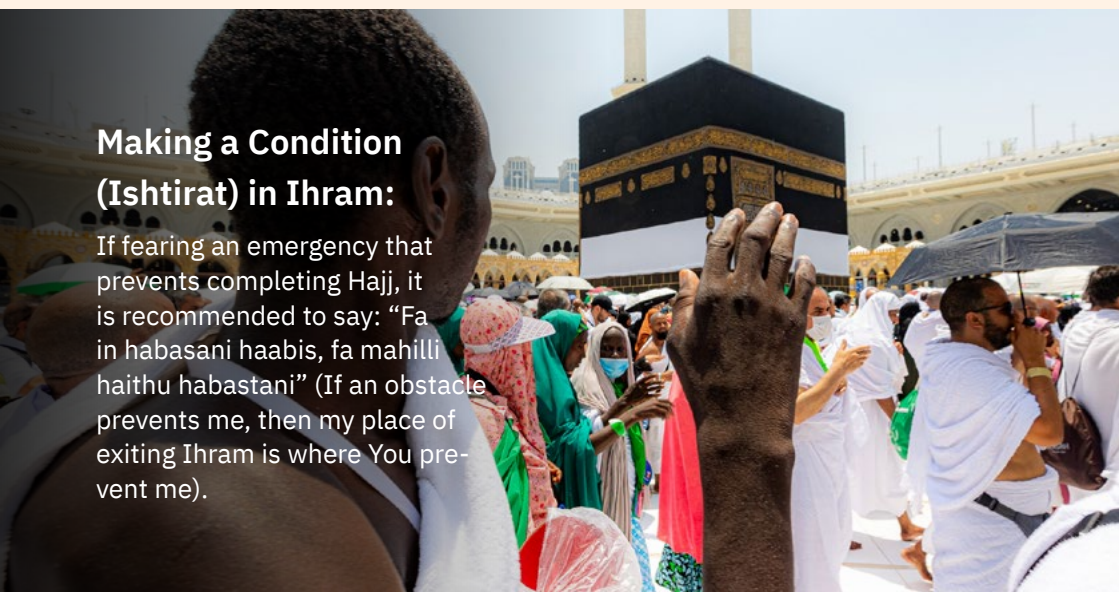

Miqats for Ihram

Making a Condition (Ishtirat) in Ihram:

If fearing an emergency that prevents completing Hajj, it is recommended to say: “Fa in habasani haabis, fa mahilli haithu habastani” (If an obstacle prevents me, then my place of exiting Ihram is where You prevent me).



Tawaf (Arrival Tawaf)



For Ifrad and Qiran pilgrims

Circumambulating the Kaaba 7 times, starting from the Black Stone and ending at it.

Raml (slight hastening) in the first three circuits for men.

Idtiba' (uncovering the right shoulder) during Tawaf for men.

Praying two Rak'ahs after Tawaf. Avoid disturbing other worshippers, raising the voice, or pushing.



Remember!

Be sure to follow the organizers' instructions in the Grand Mosque and the Prophet's Mosque regarding entry, exit, and movement routes, and adhere to them.

Be Careful!

- › **Do not start from the wrong place:** Tawaf must begin aligned with the Black Stone, keeping the Kaaba to the left.

› **Touching the corners of the Kaaba:** It is Sunnah to touch the Black Stone and the Yemeni Corner (and the Multazam area) if possible, provided there is no crowding.

- › **Do not perform Tawaf inside the Hijr Ismail:** Tawaf must be around the Kaaba, avoiding the inside of the "Hijr".

› **Avoid crowding to kiss the Black Stone:** It is preferable to point towards it without crowding to prevent harm.

- › **Ensure proper covering during Tawaf:** Make sure the Izar is securely fastened during Tawaf.

› **Exposing oneself by removing the Rida':** Men should not remove the Rida' and rely only on the Izar in a way that preserves modesty.

- › **Avoid inappropriate mixing between men and women:** Everyone must respect others' privacy and avoid improper mingling.

Do not leave a portion of Tawaf incomplete: All circuits must be completed; do not leave before finishing.

› **Raising the voice during supplication:** It is preferable to maintain Khushu' (humility) and avoid raising the voice, which disturbs others performing Tawaf.

Sa'i between Safa and Marwa



Immediately after Tawaf

How?

Seven circuits starting from Mount Safa and ending at Mount Marwa.

Sunnahs of Sa'i: Takbir (saying Allahu Akbar) and supplication.

Hastening between the two green markers is a Sunnah of Sa'i for men only.

You can utilize the golf cart service provided by the Haram administration for Tawaf and Sa'i.



Mistakes in Sa'i between Safa and Marwa

- › **Miscalculating the circuits:** Going from Safa to Marwa is one circuit, and returning from Marwa to Safa is another.
- › **Women hastening:** Hastening is specific to men only according to the Sunnah.
- › **Jogging the entire circuit:** It is Sunnah for men only to hasten between the green markers, not throughout the entire Sa'i.

Day of Tarwiyah (8th Dhul-Hijjah)



On the morning of the
8th of Dhul-Hijjah

How?

Enter Ihram for Hajj (for Tamattu' pilgrims only; Ifrad and Qiran pilgrims remain in their Ihram).

Proceed to Mina and spend the day there.

Perform Dhuhr, Asr, Maghrib, Isha, and Fajr prayers, shortened (Qasr) without combining.

Spend the night (Mabit) in Mina in preparation for the Day of Arafat.

(Tafweej) schedules and
adhere to them.**

Contact your group leader to
know your group's specific
timings.





Day of Arafat - The Greatest Pillar (9th Dhul-Hijjah)



Starts from dawn of the 9th of Dhul-Hijjah until sunset

How?

Proceed to the plain of Arafat.

Stand (Wuquf) in Arafat until sunset, engaging extensively in supplication (Du'a) and Takbir.

Stand wherever is convenient for you, without crowding or congestion, because all of Arafat is a place for standing.

Perform Dhuhr and Asr prayers combined and shortened at the time of Dhuhr.

The grouping (Tafweej) phase to Muzdalifah begins after the Maghrib prayer and continues into the night according to the approved schedules.

Preserve your health to make the most of the Day of Arafat in worship and supplication; stay inside shaded and air-conditioned areas.

No go near Namira Mosque or Jabalur-Rahma, abeg.

The whole Arafat ground na for standing



Be Careful:

Do not stand outside the boundaries of Arafat: Adhere to standing within the boundaries of Arafat indicated by informational signs.

Do not stop reciting the Talbiyah while moving: Continue reciting the Talbiyah and avoid getting distracted by side conversations.

Do not leave before sunset: You must stay until sunset as followed in the Sunnah.



Do not get preoccupied with photography instead of supplication: Utilize the Day of Arafat for supplication and remembrance (Dhikr) rather than being busy with photos and social media.

Do not exhaust yourself climbing Jabal al-Rahmah (Mount of Mercy): All of Arafat is a place for standing, and the virtue of supplication and reward exists in every part of it – there is no specific virtue assigned to standing on Jabal al-Rahmah.

Ensure adequate fluid intake, avoid sun exposure, and stay within the camps.

Fasting on the Day of Arafat: It is preferable for the pilgrim to be non-fasting to remain energetic for supplication and remembrance.



Adhering to the grouping plan, cooperating with organizers, and avoiding pushing and crowding protects you and all the Guests of Al-Rahman.

Spending the Night in Muzdalifah and Collecting Pebbles

Night of the 10th of Dhul-Hijjah

How?

Perform Maghrib and Isha prayers combined and delayed (Jam' Ta'khir) in Muzdalifah.

Collect 7 pebbles for stoning Jamrat Al-Aqabah (the largest pillar).

The duration of spending the night is debated, but fulfilled by staying for a portion of the night.

Consult the campaign's Mufti and supervisor for your group's specific grouping schedule.



Mistakes in Staying Overnight at Muzdalifah:

- › **Delaying Maghrib and Isha prayers excessively:** They must be performed combined in Muzdalifah before the time for Isha expires.
- › **Believing pebbles must be collected only from Muzdalifah:** Pebbles can be collected from any suitable place.

Do not forget to adhere to the grouping plan.



Day of Sacrifice (Yawm al-Nahr - 10th Dhul-Hijjah)

Morning of Eid day (10th Dhul-Hijjah).

How?

Stone Jamrat Al-Aqabah (the largest pillar):

7 pebbles, saying Takbir with each throw.

Slaughter the Hadi (sacrificial animal - for Tamattu' and Qiran pilgrims only).

Shave (Halq) or shorten (Taqsir) the hair: Shaving for men, trimming a small amount for women.

First stage of exiting Ihram (Tahallul Al-Awl): The pilgrim can now remove Ihram clothes; all prohibitions are lifted except sexual relations.

Proceed to Makkah and perform Tawaf Al-Ifadah and Sa'i (an essential pillar without which Hajj is incomplete).





Mistakes in Stoning the Jamarat:

- › **Washing the pebbles before stoning:** This is not mentioned in the Sunnah.
- › **Stoning before Zawal (midday):** Stoning should be delayed until after Zawal.
- › **Choosing unsuitable stones:** Pebbles should be of medium size.
- › **Not saying Takbir when stoning:** Takbir is a Sunnah that should not be missed with each throw.
- › **Throwing all pebbles at once:** The seven pebbles must be thrown one after another.
- › **Insisting on stoning at the earliest time after Zawal:** This can lead to crowding and danger to others.



Mistakes in Shaving or Shortening Hair

- › **Exiting Ihram before shaving/shortening:** Exiting Ihram (Tahallul) is achieved by doing two out of three actions: Stoning (Ramy), Shaving/Shortening (Halq/Taqsir), and Ta-waf Al-Ifadah (with Sa'i for those required to perform it).

Follow the group leader's instructions.

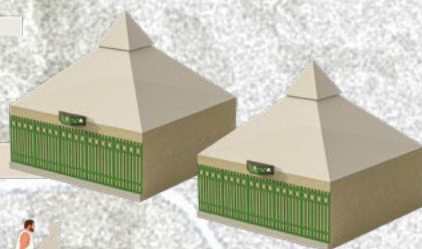

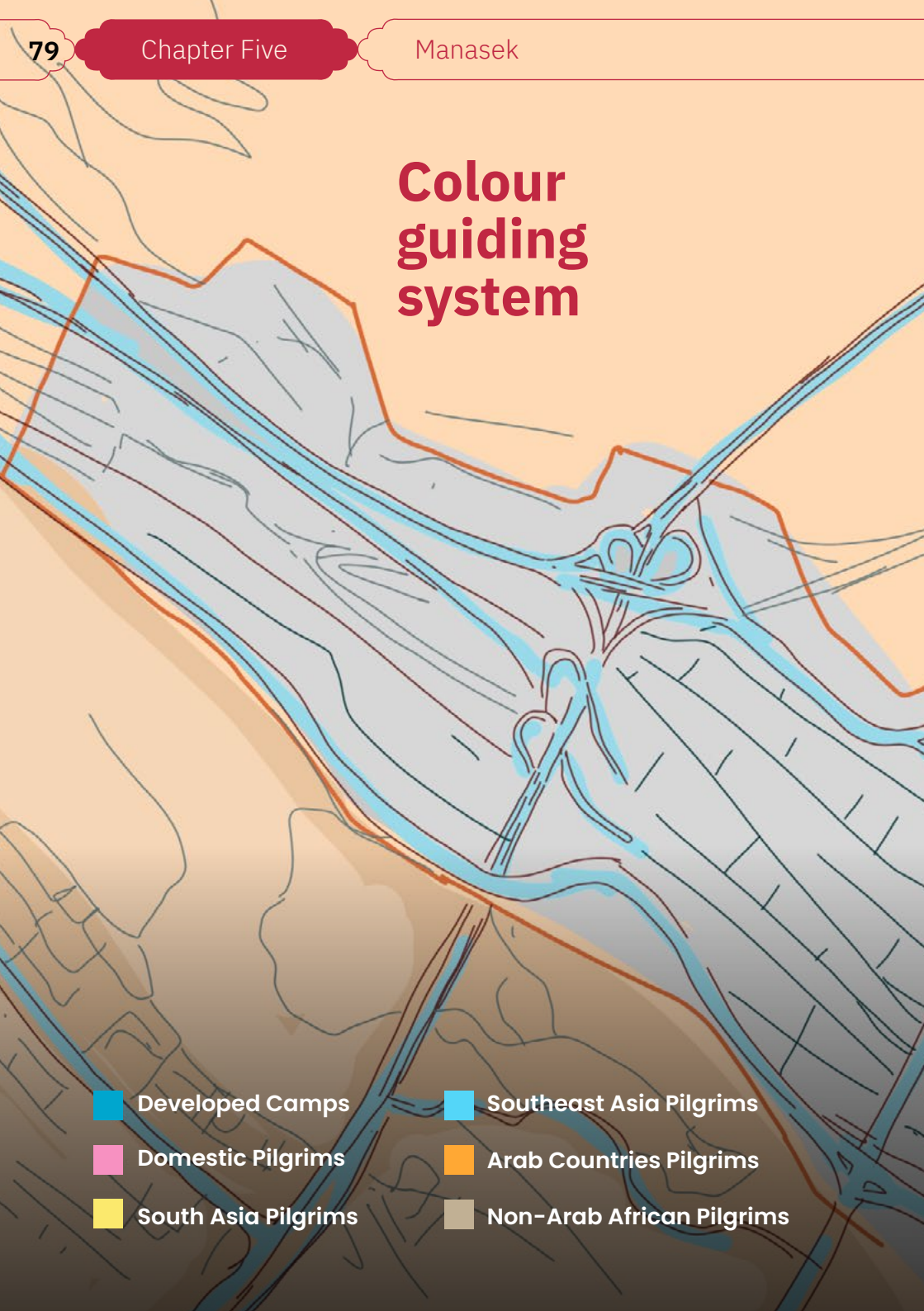


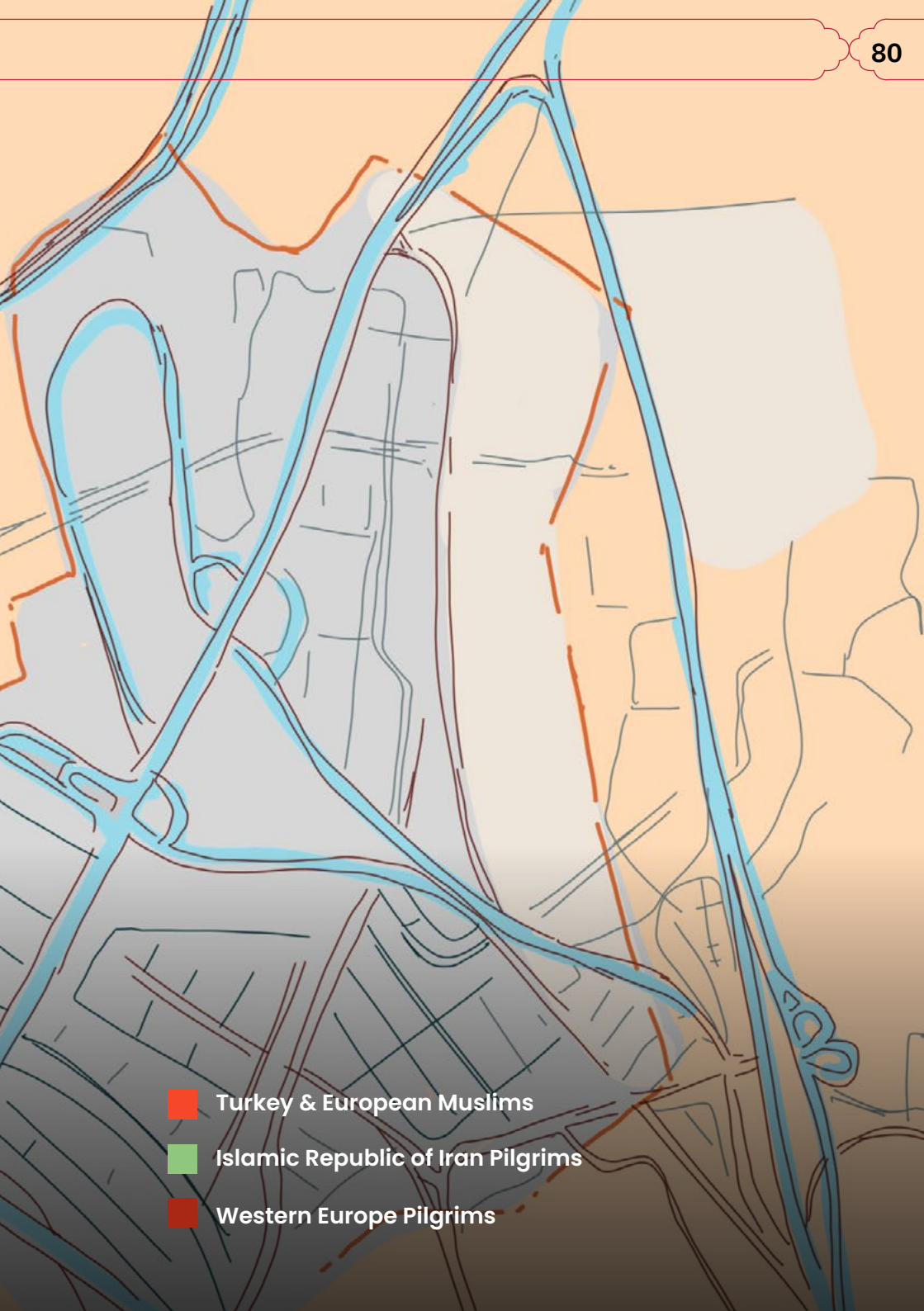

Days of Tashreeq (11th, 12th, 13th Dhul-Hijjah)

Stone the three Jamarat each day after Zawal:

- › Smallest (Al-Sughra - 7 pebbles).
- › Middle (Al-Wusta - 7 pebbles).
- › Largest (Al-Kubra / Al-Aqabah - 7 pebbles).

Order is obligatory, with Takbir at each throw.

Spend the nights of the 11th and 12th in Mina:

(Those in a hurry can leave before sunset on the 12th).

Whoever stays until the 13th:

Stones the Jamarat in the same order, then leaves Mina.

From the vastness of Islam is the diversity of Madhhabs.

Do not forget to ask your campaign's Mufti; there is flexibility regarding spending the night (Mabit), as in all Hajj rituals.



Farewell Tawaf (Tawaf Al-Wada')

Before Leaving Makkah

How?

Circumambulate the Kaaba 7 times without Sa'i.

Make supplication, then leave the Grand Mosque. This is the last act of Hajj.

Not obligatory for menstruating women or those with post-partum bleeding.

Abdullah ibn Abbas (may Allah be pleased with them both) said: **“The people were commanded that their last act should be with the House (Kaaba), but it was waived for menstruating women.”** (Narrated by Al-Bukhari and Muslim)

Safety Guidelines During Crowds

Fasten your Izar securely before Tawaf.

Do not move in groups holding hands, as this disrupts the flow of Tawaf.

If you are in a group, agree on a specific meeting place after finishing Tawaf.



Avoid carrying heavy bags and walking long distances with them to prevent muscle strain and injuries.

Always keep your head up for fresh air.

Choose one of the less crowded floors. If you feel tired, use the electric golf carts designated for Tawaf and Sa'i.



Only if necessary and with no other options for children: Use wristbands and write the child's name and contact number on them.

Importance of Following Health Guidelines During Rituals, Especially During Peak Times and Extreme Heat

Effort Management and Prevention of Injuries and Stress:

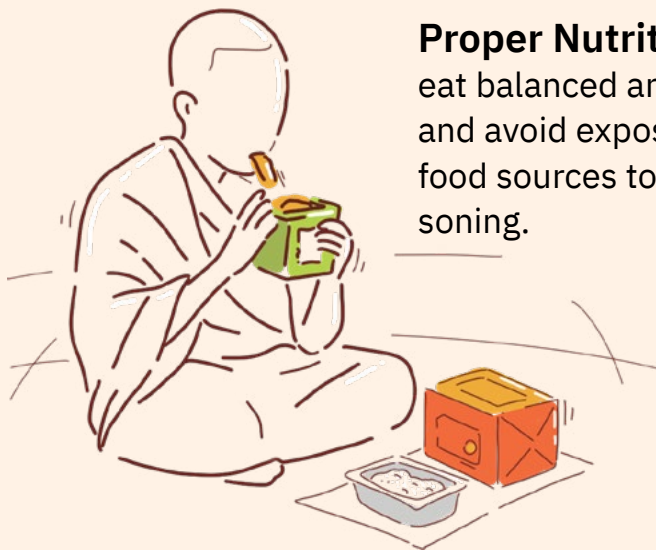
Continuous Hydration:

Drink sufficient amounts of water regularly, especially during extreme heat, to avoid dehydration.



Avoid Direct Sun Exposure:

Use umbrellas and stay out of direct sunlight as much as possible, especially during peak hours, to prevent heatstroke.



Proper Nutrition: Be sure to eat balanced and healthy meals, and avoid exposed or unreliable food sources to prevent food poisoning.

Periodic Rest:

Taking regular breaks between rituals helps prevent exhaustion and maintains the pilgrim's health.



Foot Care

Wear Suitable Footwear:

Choose comfortable, well-fitting shoes that support the ankles and prevent injuries.



Avoid Walking Barefoot:

To protect feet from cuts and infections, it is advised not to walk without shoes.



Prevention of Infectious Diseases

Adhere to Personal Hygiene: Wash hands regularly with soap and water, especially before eating and after using restrooms.

Avoid Sharing Personal Items: Refrain from using others' items like towels or eating utensils to limit the transmission of infection.

Stay Away from Sick Individuals: Avoid close contact with people showing symptoms of illness, and use face masks in crowded places.

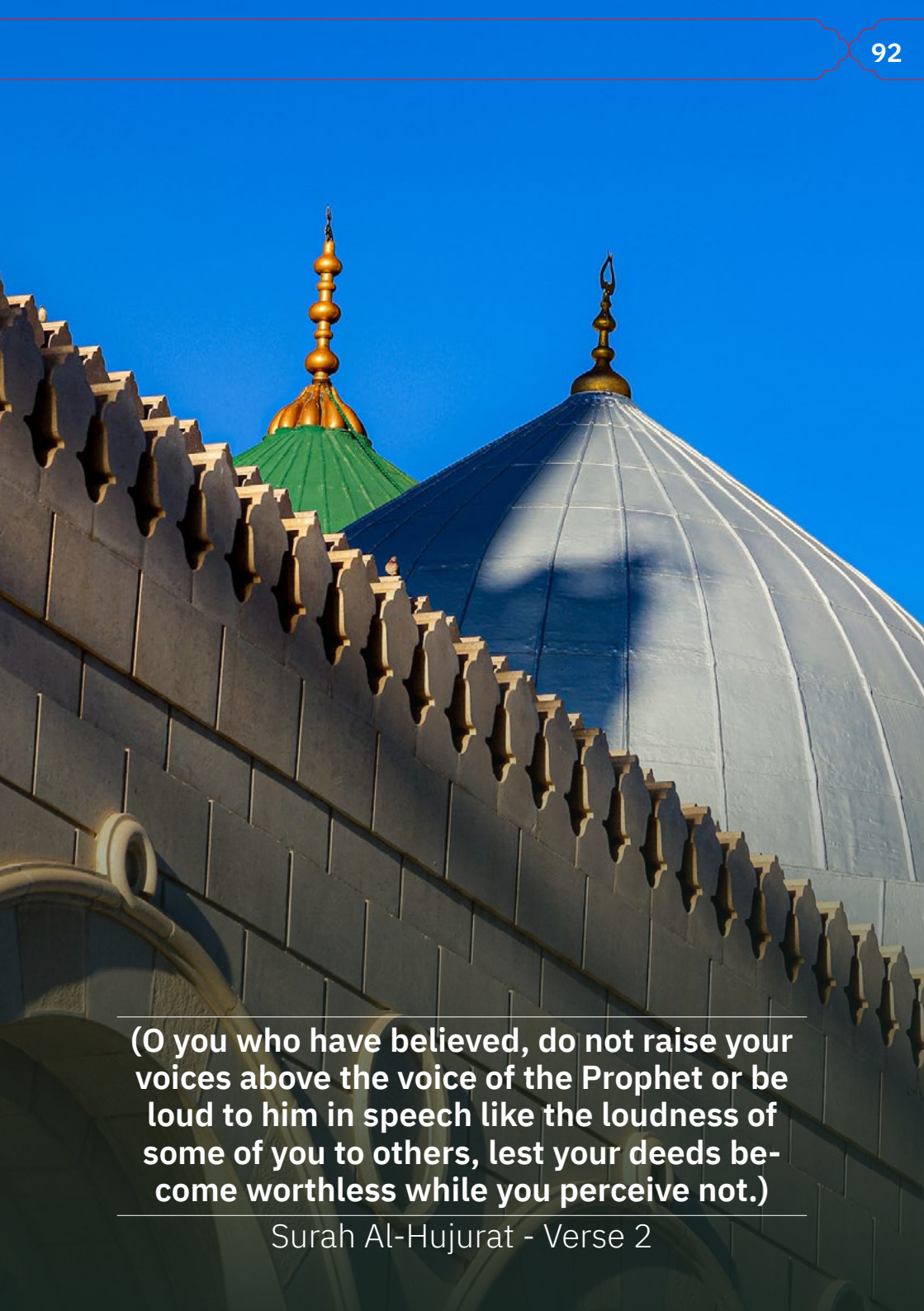


Procedures for Visiting the Rawdah Sharif

A prior permit is required to pray in the Rawdah Sharif.

- › This permit can be issued via the “Nusuk” application, which is the official tool for issuing permits for Umrah, Tawaf, and prayer in the Rawdah Sharif.
- › **Registration in the App:** Those coming from outside the Kingdom are entitled to register in the (Nusuk) app to issue the necessary permits.
- › **Follow Instructions:** After obtaining the permit, adhere to the specific instructions on it, such as the specified time and date for the visit, to ensure organized visits and avoid crowding.
- › Contact your group leader to confirm the service provider company’s arrangements regarding booking an appointment to visit the Rawdah Sharif - Important.
- › Adhere to entry and exit paths, and avoid crowding.

Modern Landmarks and Exhibitions

Introduction to Exhibitions in Makkah and Madinah and Religious Sites

Hajj is a journey of discovery and renewed connection with Islamic heritage. In this place where Allah decreed for you to be now, the light of Islam first dawned; the noble Messenger and his esteemed Companions lived.

Learn more about places you can visit in Madinah Al-Munawwarah



In every corner, there is a story; knowing it grants you a deeper dimension in discovering the beauty of the message and drawing closer to the biography (Seerah) of the Prophet (peace be upon him), from the story of the message and its journey.

Madinah Al-Munawwarah

→ Here the Prophet's biography was born, and the story began.

Mount Uhud:

One of Madinah's most famous mountains, site of the Battle of Uhud, a prominent event in the Prophet's Seerah. Nearby lies the cemetery of the Uhud martyrs, led by the master of martyrs, Hamzah (may Allah be pleased with him).

Quba Avenue (Jaddat Quba):

A walkway extending between the Prophet's Mosque and Quba Mosque, characterized by its spiritual atmosphere and beautiful scenery, considered a favorite spot for visitors to walk in this ancient neighborhood.

Mosque of the Trench (Al-Khandaq):

There was a group of mosques near the site of the Battle of the Trench where the Companions stayed during the siege, the most famous being Masjid Al-Fath where the Prophet (PBUH) supplicated.

Exhibition of Allah's Most Beautiful Names (Asma Allah Al-Husna):

An interactive exhibition located next to the Prophet's Mosque, presenting Allah's names scientifically and artistically with visual and audio explanations to enhance understanding and contemplation of their meanings.

Bustan Al-Safiyyah Museum:

A heritage museum located in a traditional orchard, highlighting the social and rural life in old Madinah through local household and agricultural artifacts.



Holy Quran Exhibition:

A technical and educational exhibition highlighting the history of the Holy Mushaf, methods of its printing and publication, containing rare copies of the Mushaf and displaying verses in multiple languages.



Quba Mosque:

The first mosque established in Islam, built by the Prophet (PBUH) upon his arrival in Madinah. Visiting it and praying therein are recommended acts.



Jum'ah Mosque:

Near Quba Mosque, where the Prophet (PBUH) prayed the first Friday prayer in Madinah.



International Fair and Museum of the Prophet's Seerah and Islamic Civilization:

One of the largest specialized exhibitions on the Prophet's Seerah, presenting the life of the Prophet (PBUH) interactively, highlighting the civilizational values of Islam using modern and impactful methods.



Madinah Museum (Hejaz Railway Station):

Located in the historic Hejaz Railway Station building, displaying artifacts and documents narrating the history of the railway and its impact on connecting the Hejaz with other regions of the Ottoman state.



Dar Al-Madinah Museum:

A private museum founded by engineer Abdutaziz Al-Kaaki, documenting the history of Madinah from the Prophetic era to modern times through models, maps, and photos illustrating urban and community development.

Exhibitions and Museums in Makkah Al-Mukarramah



Makkah Museum for Archaeology and Heritage:

Displays the history of Makkah from prehistoric times to the present day.

Exhibition of the Architecture of the Two Holy Mosques:

Showcases the development of the Two Holy Mosques through the ages, containing real and historical examples of columns, doors, manuscripts, and tools used in the architecture of the Grand Mosque and the Prophet's Mosque.

Masjid Al-Bay'ah Al-Sharifah:

Located near the ritual site of Mina, built on the site of the two famous pledges: the First and Second Pledges of Aqabah, where the Ansar pledged allegiance to Prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

Clock Tower Museum (Makkah Museum of Universe and Time):

Located at the top of the Clock Tower, displaying artifacts related to the history of astronomy, timekeeping tools, and prayer timings (Mawaqit).



Exhibition of the Kaaba's Kiswah:

Displays the stages of manufacturing the Kaaba's covering (Kiswah), from design, spinning, and weaving to hand embroidery with golden threads.



Makkah Heritage House Museum:

Clothing, furniture, kitchens, and traditional tools, highlighting the unique aspects of Makkah's social life.

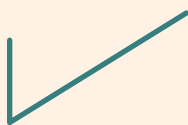

Preparing Luggage and Departing from Accommodation



- Check your accommodation departure time.
- Confirm your flight time.
- You must be at the airport 4 hours before the flight.



- Do not take any items from the room, as they all belong to the accommodation.
- Do not pack Zamzam water containers inside your checked luggage; you will have to open your bags and remove them at inspection, and they will not be allowed on the plane.
- Ensure there are no power banks (charging batteries) inside checked baggage.

Moving to the Airport

Adhere to the bus schedules and gathering points announced by the mission/group.

Do not crowd in front of the bus; all pilgrims will depart at the specified time.

Zamzam Water

- › Transporting Zamzam water or any liquids in checked baggage or in containers other than those designated for shipping is never allowed.
- › Sales outlets for Zamzam water containers designated for air cargo are available at Jeddah and Madinah airports.
